Call Number for Library Trip

Find your way to your call number by using the [call number location guide](#). Many of your sources will be found in the PN call number area on the 7th floor. Navigate to [this page](#) with all floors and locations to help guide you through the library.



While in the stacks, look in the immediate vicinity of the book you're trying to find. What other books are there that might prove useful to you or cause you to ask different questions related to your research topic? Write significant book discoveries below.



Come back to the group meeting space and look through your source for evidence that might help your argument. Take some preliminary notes to assist with your future annotation.



Write out the citation for your source.



Tip: Use the citation tool the library has provided. Click “citation” and then click “Chicago/Turabian” to see how to cite the book correctly.
